

It is the only government aided college in 30 kilometer radius which is affiliated to Panjab University Chandigarh, Our college has been offering latest courses at nominal fees alongwith host of scholarships for underprivileged students. The multi faculty post graduate college offers postgraduate degree in Commerce. It has undergraduate courses in Commerce and Humanities, alongwith Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application. Over 500 students are the part of the programmes being run in the college. The college holds good positions in both academics and sports in Panjab University Chandigarh. The College is also fortunate to have galaxy of eminent personalities in management alongwith dedicated and most qualified faculty in the whole region. ## RULES FOR ADMISSION

1. Students are admitted without any discrimination based on religion, caste, creed or colour
2. Failed Students or students with Compartment from other institutions and the students from our college who have repeatedly failed can be admitted only on the special permission of the Principal and the as per the rules of Panjab University Chandigarh.
3. Students disqualified by any Board/University shall not be eligible for admission.
4. Any student who didn't appear in the University/Board Exam will be treated as gap-case and may be refused admission.
5. Migration shall not be allowed without genuine reasons.
6. The Principal is competent to refuse admission to a student on the grounds of indiscipline and misconduct.
7. Any admission can be rejected if the student is found guilty of concealing information and submitting bogus certificate.
8. In case the admission is rejected after scrutiny, fees and funds deposited with the college will not be paid back.
9. History and Culture of Punjab as a subject of study can only be opted by the students who are not domiciled in Punjab and have not studied Punjabi upto class X.

## USEFUL INSTRUCTIONS FOR CANDIDATES

1. The application form must be filled in by the candidate in his or her own handwriting in a clear & legible manner.
2. The application form complete in all respects must be submitted to the college office as has been indicated in the Admission Notice 2022 as well as in the Prospectus on or before the last date indicated even if the result of the qualifying exam has not been declared.
3. The application form must be completed in all respects. No column should be left unfilled. If any information sought is not applicable to the candidate the word 'NA' should be entered against the column.
4. Attested copies of Board, University Certificates claiming special status etc. must be attached with the application. In case the required documents are not attached, the application is liable to be rejected as incomplete.

## LATE ADMISSION

A student whose result of +2 examination conducted by a School Board is published late, but not later than 10th August of the year of admission may be admitted without late fee within 15 working days of the declaration of the result & his/her attendance shall be counted from the date of admission.

In the case of P.U. students who have already appeared in any of its examinations & the result is declared late for one reason or the other, the admission cannot be said to be a case of fresh admission. In their cases, admissions to the next class/course are allowed within 10 days, from the date of dispatch of the result without charging any late fee.

## RULES FOR WITHDRAWAL

A student who wishes to leave the college must apply in writing to the Principal. The application must be countersigned by his/her parent or a responsible guardian. No student will be permitted to leave the college until he/she has cleared all college dues.

A student has to pay college fees and all other dues until his/her name is formally withdrawn. Refund of fees will not be permitted except the refundable security.

## COLLEGE LEAVE RULES





## LIBRARY

This is the pride of our college. It has huge, spacious & attractive building. It has more than 22,393 books of Arts, Science and Commerce with bar-coding. Most of the activities of the library are computerized. At present we have 6 magazines and 12 journals of Hindi, Punjabi & English & 8 leading newspapers of three languages. (All the books are arranged subject wise on shelves for open browsing). The surroundings of the library are comfortable and ideal for study & there are ample reading spaces available for quiet study especially its huge-sized Reading Room.

However, rural colleges face a serious handicap when it comes to digital accessibility to information. ## LIBRARY RULES

1. Two books to each student of U.G. & three books to student of P.G. are issued for a period of 14 days only.
2. A fine of one rupee per day per volume is charged for the books returned after the due date.
3. Reference books, text books, rare books & periodicals are not issued except for consultation in the library.
4. The students are required to possess their identity cards while inside the Library Reading Rooms.  
Defaulters will be asked to leave & their cases will be reported to the Principal.
5. Books issued from the Library should be kept carefully & in no case be underlined or disfigured. If a book is already damaged in any form, it should be reported to the issuing Library Attendant or the Librarian. Once the book is issued, the student will be held responsible for the damage.
6. The loss of a book should be reported to the library before the due date in the absence of which the usual fine will be charged. The borrower will be required to replace it or to pay double its price along with his next college dues if the book is not replaced.
7. The students are expected to observe silence in the Reading Room & not to disturb others in anyway.
